

## The ISLANDS of GUERNSEY

**Always wanted to island-hop around the Balearics/Greece? Try the Islands of Guernsey instead**



Whilst you may associate island hopping culture with Greece or the Balearics, why not enjoy a more affordable option and explore island hopping closer to home. With the Channel Islands located nearby the UK, this destination does not require the carbon footprint of longer haul destinations. With the option to take the ferry over the Channel, and island hop by sailboat between the many islands, including Sark and Herm, there are many ways in which visitors can easily reduce their impact on their surroundings whilst saving on flight costs. The plethora of turquoise coves and sandy beaches make the Channel Islands the new must-do island hopping journey.

- **Guernsey** – Your steppingstone to its surrounding neighbours, this 25sqm island is ample with invigorating wellness and adventure activities, whilst also abundant in fine dining choices. From surfing the shores of Vazon Bay to a Stand-up Paddleboard yoga session, and home to a multitude of golf courses, there's something for every kind of traveller
- **Alderney** – Just an hour by ferry from Guernsey, Alderney is home to 2,000 acres of wetland, woodland and grassland, teeming with wildlife both on and off-shore. Visitors can partake in one of the many walking, cycling or boat tours that take you around the island, whilst staying in the comfort of luxury boutique property, The Blonde Hedgehog, and enjoying the farm-to-table menu offered by Head Chef Stephen Scott
- **Sark** – A 45-minute ferry ride, Sark is one of the few remaining places in the world where cars are banned from roads. The crown jewel of the Channel Islands, expect spectacular scenery from coastal clifftops and horse-drawn carriage rides through the picturesque landscape
- **Lihou** - A tidal island situated off the west coast of Guernsey, Lihou is only accessible via a quarter-mile causeway at low tide. Just 36 acres in size, the island is mostly dedicated to the preservation of rare birds and plants. Visitors must check the tide timetable to ensure that the tide doesn't come in and cut them off from the mainland – otherwise enjoy a 6 hour wait!
