Hauteville House opens at the beginning of April and is an absolute must-see if you are visiting Guernsey. The House, which was home to French writer, Victor Hugo, for 14 years has recently undergone a major 18-month-long restoration and is widely regarded as a piece of art in its own right.

During his exile in Guernsey, the Island inspired some of his most famous works, including *Les Misérables* and *Toilers of the Sea*, which he dedicated to the island. Take a guided tour of the house, and a peek into the fabulously eccentric world of one of the world's most revered authors.

Join us for Liberation Day

The Channel Islands were the only part of the British Isles to be occupied during World War II, and the Islands of Guernsey lived under German control from June 1940 to May 1945. During the Occupation, German troops fortified the Islands, building bunkers and tunnels and adapting existing defences, which can all still be visited today.

2023 marks the 78th anniversary of the Liberation of the Islands and is celebrated on 9 May. It represents the freedom that many of our parents and grandparents were not afforded during these years.



The festivities provide an opportunity to remember the dark days of the Occupation, which played such a monumental role in shaping both the landscape and the lives of the people of Guernsey.

In 2023, another momentous event will take place in the days leading up to our own special day, with the planned Coronation of King Charles III on Sat 6 May, and an additional Bank Holiday on Mon 8 May. Why not visit this year and spend a long weekend celebrating with us.

Island hopping

A trip to one of our sister Islands, Alderney, Sark, Herm and Lihou, is an absolute must if you visit. Each of the Islands have their own very unique feel and character.

Herm is small but perfectly formed with some of the most spectacular beaches in the Channel Islands. With its clear turquoise seas, this tiny car-free island with unspoilt beaches, lush greenery and stunning coastal scenery, which are home to Europe's most southerly puffin-breeding colony, can easily be explored on foot in a couple of hours.

Sark is famed for its slow pace of life, where people get around on bikes or horse and cart. With one of the most unique High

Streets in the British Isles, the unpaved roads weave across Sark's beautiful landscape, revealing hidden bays, great places to eat and even an Royal Horticulture Society-recommended garden at La Seigneurie.

Alderney is the third largest of the Channel Islands and best known for being home to the blonde hedgehog. More than 300 species of bird also choose to make Alderney their home to nest in each year, making it a bird watchers paradise. With its stunning sandy beaches, a great selection of places to eat, fascinating history and wildlife and birdlife unique to the Island, Alderney offers a relaxed way of life, in a safe environment, where quality time is easy to find.

Lihou Island is reached on foot at certain low tides, when the receding tide reveals a 570m ancient stone causeway leading to the Island's fantastic rock pools, priory ruins, RAMSAR-designated wetlands and the 'Venus Pool', a natural swimming pool formed in the rocks.





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

Beaches, bays & coves for days

The best bit about being on our beaches is how they make you feel.

In the cooler months, it's about wrapping up and taking a walk, watching the wild waves crash along the shoreline and embracing the fresh air. In the summer, it's about feeling the warmth of the sun on your back and the cool sea on your toes.

We are spoilt for choice when it comes to our beautiful beaches, with secluded coves to the south and long sweeping sands to the west and north.

With one of the largest tidal ranges in the world, our beaches are ever changing.

High tide is magical, leaving just enough beach to perch on and take in the view. Low tide reveals the best rockpools to pootle about in and find beach treasure.

There are ancient caves to explore, natural and man-made saltwater pools and sheltered bays that are just perfect for a paddle.

For the more adventurous, our coastline is nature's playground. Jump into our crystal clear waters, kayak along the coastline, surf, paddleboard, or try your hand at coasteering. All along the coast there are colourful kiosks, each with their own unique character, offering a cuppa and a homemade cake, a local ice-cream and a crab sandwich.

'One of my favourite swims for a sunrise is Marble Bay. It's really off the beaten track. You meander down many little pathways and the beauty just opens up before you. It's a real hidden gem in Guernsey. You'll really find peace and quiet down here. It really is worth the effort of coming down to Marble Bay.'

Take the plunge in the Islands of Guernsey

Local ambassador, Jayne Packham, swims all year round with a small, enthusiastic group. She said whether you are long distance swimmer or a dipper, the Islands of Guernsey has it all.

'The feeling of getting in - it's such a reset. You just get such a buzz,' she said.

For a quiet swim adventure, the south coast bays off the cliff path such as Marble Bay are the perfect choice. But there is much more on offer on the Islands for every swimmer.

The Islands have one of the largest tidal ranges in the world, with regular nine to 10 metre tides. This means you can experience two completely different swims in the same bay, depending on what time you go.

Cold water swimming is proven to not only help our physical health but also improve our mental wellbeing. Quite simply, sea swimming gives you the feel-good factor.

From watching the sunrise from our east coast bays to a sunset dip out west, there's no better place to give it a go than the clear waters of the Islands of Guernsey.

The local wild swimmer loves nothing more than being in the water and exploring all that our bays and beaches have to offer, from sunrise to sunset.

Jayne recommends...

- **A Sunrise Swim at Marble Bay (Le Pied du Mur)**

This small, secluded rocky cove situated near the south east point of the Island, has stunning views towards Herm and Sark.

- **A Quick Dip at Havelet Bay**

Havelet is along the front in St Peter Port and also home to the recently restored La Vallette bathing pools.

- **A Sunset Swim at Les Amarreurs**

This hidden gem on Guernsey's north coast has a small jetty at the western end of L'Ancrese Common, complete with children's playground along with public toilets and plenty of parking.

Adventures in the great outdoors

The Islands of Guernsey are a bird watchers paradise all year round, where you will be able to spot some of the 150 species of birds that call us home, including the Eurasian Spoonbill, Red Kites, and the European Bee-eater.

The wildlife and birds who choose to make the Islands their home have complete freedom in our uncrowded cliff perches, wetlands and waters.

Between April and July, the Puffins nest high on Herm's cliff edges and are rafting in the waters around the Islands, distinguishable by their

brightly-coloured beaks. They are all able to thrive in this natural environment all year round, and we are lucky enough to live alongside in awe.

For keen twitchers, a trip to Alderney between April and October, to see the two Gannet colonies, is an absolute must.

The waters around Guernsey are not just perfect for our wildlife but our clear waters are a mecca for keen fishermen and anglers, who can enjoy coarse or deep-sea fishing.

Whether you are casting off from the shore, pier or rocks, taking a boat trip or trying your hand at lake fishing, the Islands offer some of the most exciting and varied fishing in the most picturesque spots.

Our varied coastline, and the reefs of the Islands, are famous for being home to just about every species of fish that can be caught, so what are you waiting for?





Are you looking for some inspiration for your trip to Guernsey?

There are so many great things to do here in the Islands, and many don't cost a penny.

Follow the cobbled path for an Island adventure on Lihou and play hide and seek around our ancient dolmens and in our coastal forts and bunkers, visit the smallest of chapels, perfect for young visitors, and play in our parks and gardens.

Whether you are travelling on your own, with friends or family, or in a group, there is so much to do in the Islands of Guernsey that is free.

For a moment of coastal tranquillity or an adventurous hike, the Islands of Guernsey offer unspoilt nature for you to enjoy. Some great spots to visit include The Bluebell Woods, St Saviours Reservoir and, more recently, Les Vardes Quarry Nature Walk. The recently created 2k walk takes you around Guernsey's quarry and has amazing views of the quarry itself and the views beyond. The new addition of an Animal Adventure Trail with its beautifully carved animal statues makes it a real family favourite.

In the heart of St Peter Port, you can find year-round activities taking place in the Guille-Allès Library for children, and some meditation and book clubs for adults too. Take a walk up the hill to Candie Gardens, home to Guernsey Museum and where you can collect the key for Victoria Tower, just a short walk from the Museum. Your climb up the Tower will be rewarded with panoramic views across St Peter Port and out across our sister Islands.
