# St Peter Port



The beautiful cobbled streets of St Peter Port are only a short tender journey away and passengers land within a 5-minute walk of the main centre so passengers can maximise their time ashore easily and independently if they wish.

The town is a colourful display of flowers and bunting with a Mediterranean feel and an abundance of charm, with steep cobbled streets snaking their way up the hillside, all set against the spectacular backdrop of the 800-year-old Castle Cornet.

# Island hopping

Each of the five Islands of Guernsey have their own history and charm. With easy travel between each, Guernsey is the perfect base for island-hopping.

Discover Herm Island (20 minutes by ferry) & Sark Island (30-50 minutes by ferry) from St Peter Port. The crystal clear, turquoise waters make the islands a great place to enjoy the outdoors, whether you are exploring the cliffs and beaches or out on the water itself.





## Herm Island

A short 20-minute boat ride from St Peter Port takes you to the stunning car-free island of Herm, with white sandy beaches and turquoise waters. Visitors can enjoy a guided walk of this "paradise" island.

## Sark Island and horse-drawn carriage ride

A 35-minute boat ride from St Peter Port, takes you to the unique island of Sark. free of cars, visitors can take a bicycle ride or for something extra special, a horse-drawn carriage around the island...



## The Potato Peel Pie Experience

The Guernsey Literary and Potato Peel Pie Society is a much-loved, award-winning novel (and movie) that shares our small island's big history.

There are several guided tours designed to bring the book to life for visitors to Guernsey. Visit places described in the novel and learn more about the true stories of heroism & tragedy during the Occupation of the Channel Islands in WWII.

## West Coast cycle tour

A favourite with families, you'll be joining an experienced guide on this flat route for a bicycle tour of Guernsey. The circular loop passes along coastal paths through internationally protected RAMSAR sites, Lihou Island and the Colin Best Nature Reserve before reaching L'Eree Bay. It continues along the seafront with views out to Les Hanois Lighthouse to peaceful Portelet harbour- the perfect stop for a Guernsey crab sandwich before returning using and 'Ruelle Tranquilles'.



# Historical occupation tour and Hitler's Atlantic Wall

The Channel Islands were the only part of the British Isles to be occupied by the Germans during WWII. As a result, many towers and bunkers were built across Guernsey using forced labour to form part of Hitler's Atlantic Wall.

Tours can visit some of the coastal fortifications including gun emplacements and bunkers.

Enjoy a panoramic tour of Guernsey's coastline including stops at Little Chapel, Guernsey Pearl and beaches for photo opportunities.
