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SOAR HIGH IN SPITFIRE

EVER wanted to know what it's like to fly in a World War Two Spitfire?

Visitors to Guernsey can now find out – but it will cost them.

To mark the 80th anniversary of the D-Day landings this year, the Channel Island, which was occupied by German forces between 1940 and 1945, is letting visitors take a closer look at the classic aircraft.

On Friday and Saturday next week, an expert Spitfire company will take a group of WWII enthusiasts into the skies above Guernsey where they will soak up views of Castle Cornet, historic bunkers and the coastline, before taking a closer look at the cockpit.

The 30-minute flights come at a steep cost of £3,500pp though, so you will have to save up.
