

## Guernsey Literary Festival announces a stellar line-up of speakers for 2024's festival

Guernsey Literary Festival has announced its 2024 line-up, with star speakers to include Louise Minchin, Bryony Gordon, Michel Roux Jr and Louis de Bernières

**London, March 2024 –** The Guernsey Literary Festival has announced this year's line-up. From novelist Louis de Bernières to chef Michel Roux Jr, this year's festival is set to be one of Guernsey's biggest yet. Taking place between 23 April and 5 May 2024, the festival will be held amongst the quirky surrounds of Guernsey's historic capital, St Peter Port. Following the release of *Michel Roux at Home*, the celebrated chef will delight the crowds with descriptions of how to recreate delicious French meals from the comfort of their own kitchen. Journalist and campaigner Bryony Gordon has been inspiring readers and listeners from across the globe to open up about mental health. Visitors to the festival in 2024 will have the chance to listen to Bryony discussing her brand-new book, *Mad Woman: How to Survive a World That Thinks You're the Problem.* 

Other notable events will include presenter Louise Minchin discussing her book *Fearless – Adventures with Extraordinary Woman*, spotlighting Louise's own adventures profiling female stories of courage and endeavour. Sports fans will relish the chance to hear from Pat Nevin's moving memoir, *Football and How to Survive It*, on 3 May, whereas literary buffs will jump at the chance to hear renowned novelist Louis de Bernières speak about his recent release, *Light Over Liskeard*, on 5 May.

Visitors to the Literary Festival can recharge their batteries at <u>Camp de Reves</u>, a luxurious glampsite with panoramic sea views of Guernsey's picturesque west coast. Guests staying between 23 April and 5 May will receive 20% off their stay when they book using the code GLF.

The Guernsey Literary Festival is just one of many reasons to visit the Islands of Guernsey this year and beyond, with travellers able to explore the Islands' world-class sandy beaches, spectacular wildlife and world-class wellness options year-round. Travelling to Guernsey has never been easier, with new flight routes with Aurigny – the Islands' very own flagship airline – to launch in spring 2024 from London City, London Stansted, Liverpool and Edinburgh, and Cornwall Newquay to follow in the summer, in addition to existing schedules. Travellers keen to travel with their car or take a more mindful journey can take the ferry with Condor Ferries from Poole and Portsmouth.
