The Guernsey Travel Survey shows the number of air and sea passengers, broken down by type, purpose and origin, based upon exit surveys undertaken at the airport and harbour

Data and Analysis

1.1 Introduction

The Guernsey Travel Survey is based upon exit surveys undertaken at the airport and harbour, with the findings applied to the actual numbers of passengers (provided by the airport and harbour authorities). The purpose of these surveys is to determine the passenger composition of Guernsey's main air and sea routes, along with the number of visiting cruise passengers and visiting yachtsmen. It includes information on length of stay, purpose of visit, accommodation used, country of origin and party size.

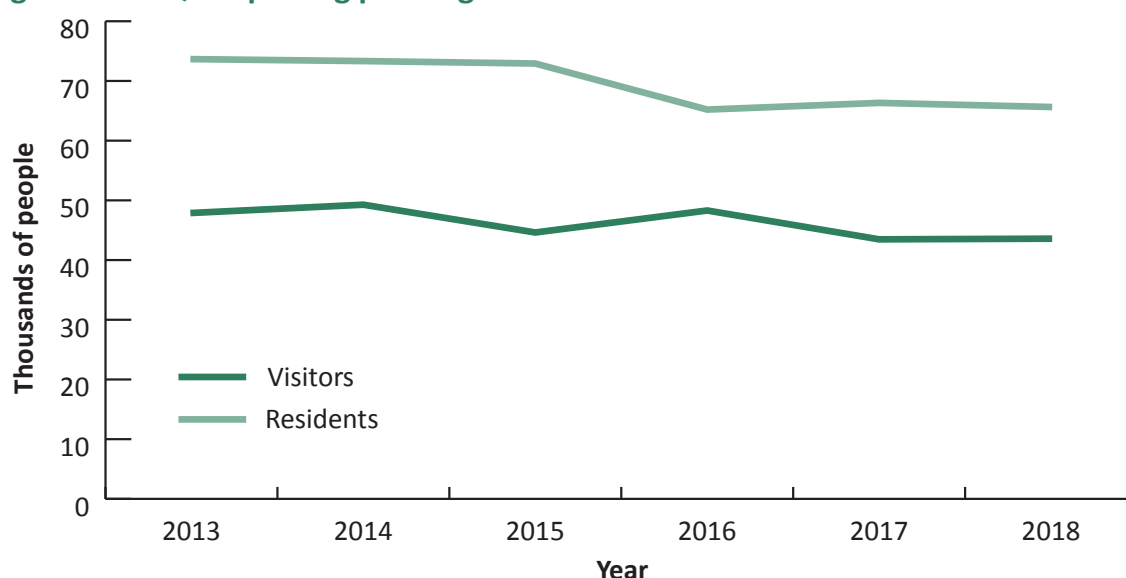
It should be noted that the figures in this report do not include inter-Bailiwick travel (Alderney, Sark and Herm).

From April 2017 the methodology for data collection was updated. Planning and deployment of interview shifts changed from quarterly to monthly, hence year on year figures are subject to methodological changes and may not be strictly comparable.

1.2 Headlines for Q4 2018

- The total number of departing **passengers** (both visitors and residents) for Q4 2018 was 109,218.
- The total number of departing **visitors** for Q4 2018 was 43,581. The total number of departing **residents** was 65,637 in Q4 2018.
- Of the 43,581 departing visitors in Q4 2018, 82% travelled by air and 18% by sea.
- 18% of visitors stayed for business purposes, 33% were visiting friends or relatives, 35% were leisure visitors staying for at least one night and a further 13% visiting for a day trip.
- The average length of stay for those who stayed at least one night in Q4 2018 was 4.15 nights.
- 78% of visitors during Q4 2018 were from the UK, 3% from France, 10% from Jersey and the remainder from elsewhere.

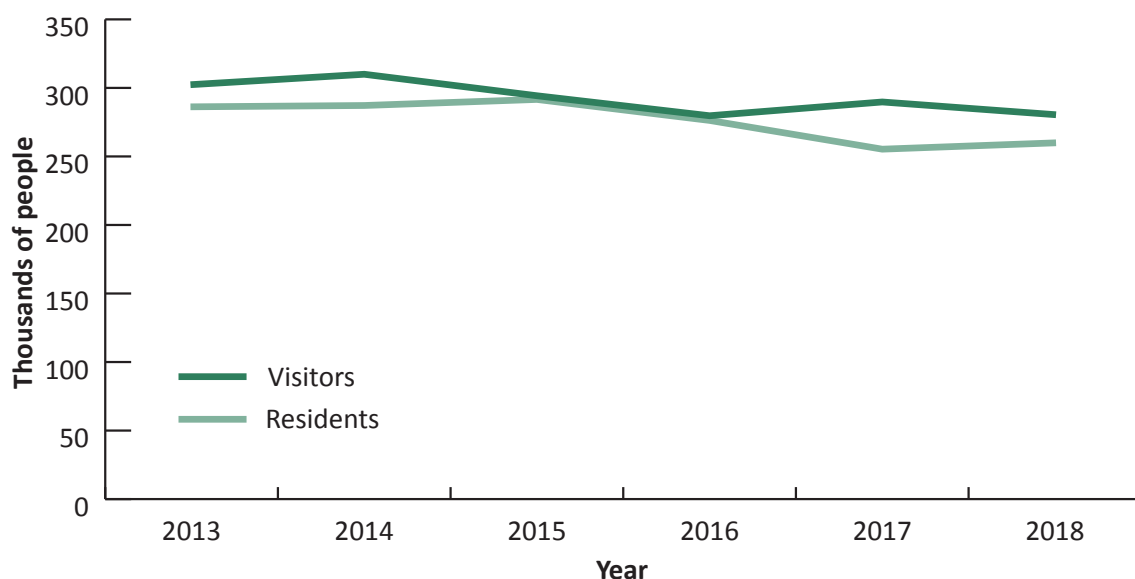

1.4 Headlines for January to December 2018

- The total number of departing **passengers** (both visitors and residents) for January to December 2018 was 540,398.
- The total number of departing **visitors** for January to December 2018 was 280,475. The total number of departing **residents** was 259,923 in January to December 2018.
- Of the 280,475 departing visitors in January to December 2018, 66% travelled by air and 34% by sea.
- 12% of visitors stayed for business purposes, 20% were visiting friends or relatives, 51% were leisure visitors staying for at least one night and a further 16% visiting for a day trip.
- The average length of stay for those who stayed at least one night in January to December 2018 was 4.66 nights.
- 72% of visitors during January to December 2018 were from the UK, 7% from France, 7% from Jersey and the remainder from elsewhere.

As shown in **Table 2.1.1**, in Q4 2018 there were 93,185 departing passengers by air and 16,034 by sea (these figures include returning visitors). This represents a <1% change in both air and sea passengers since Q4 2017.

Tables 2.1.2 and **2.1.3** show the number of departing residents and departing visitors by mode of transport (except those visitors who were returning to Guernsey after, for example, a day trip elsewhere).

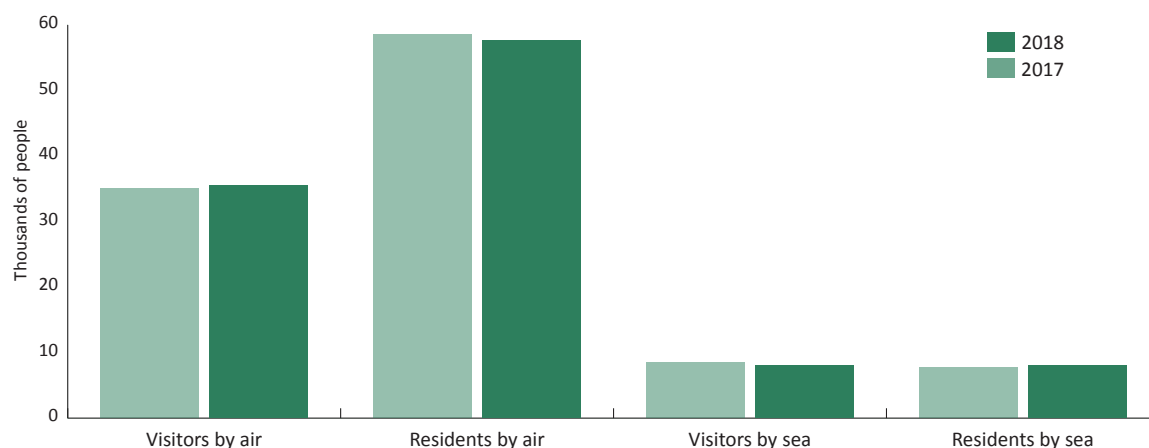

2.2 Total departing passengers January to December

As shown in **Table 2.2.1**, during the period from January to December 2018 there were 388,497 departing passengers by air and 151,901 by sea (these figures include returning visitors). This represents a drop of <1% in air passenger numbers and 2% in sea passengers since 2017.

Tables 2.2.2 and **2.2.3** show the number of departing residents and departing visitors by mode of transport (except those visitors who were returning to Guernsey after, for example, a day trip elsewhere).

The numbers of departing passengers by type and mode of transport can be seen in **Figure 2.2.1**.

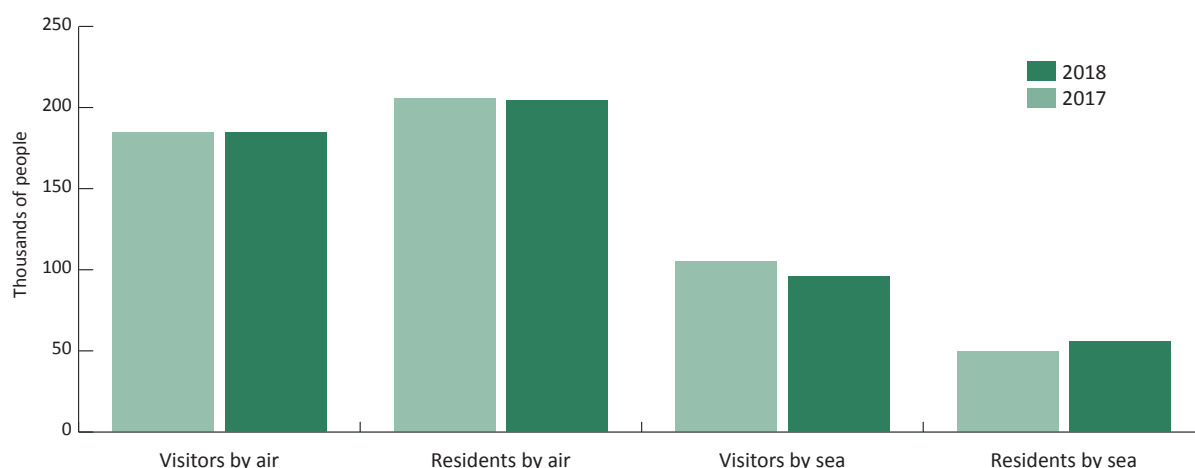

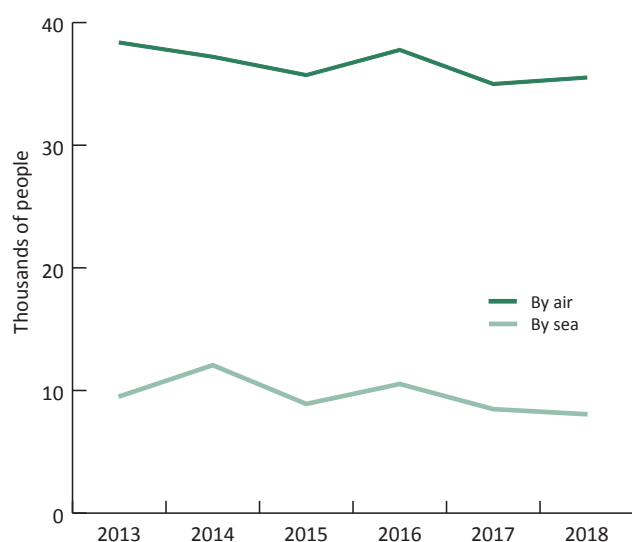

2.4 Departing visitors January to December - by mode of transport

As shown in **Table 2.4.1**, during the period from January to December 2018 there were 184,339 departing visitors by air and 96,136 by sea.

Figure 2.4.1 Jan to Dec departing visitors by mode of transport

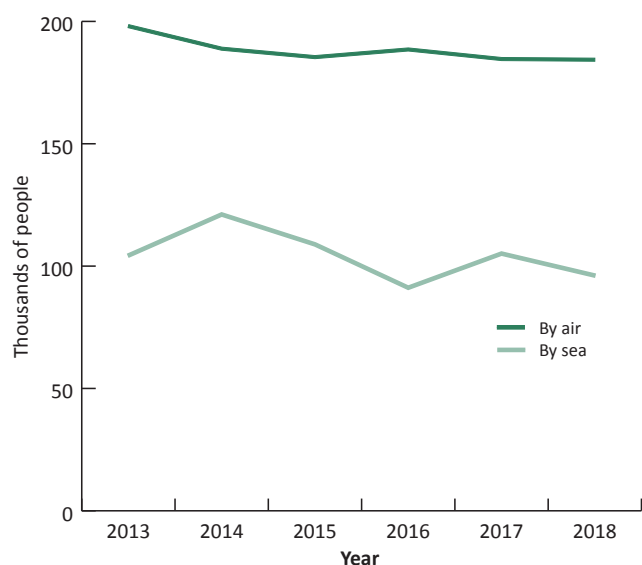


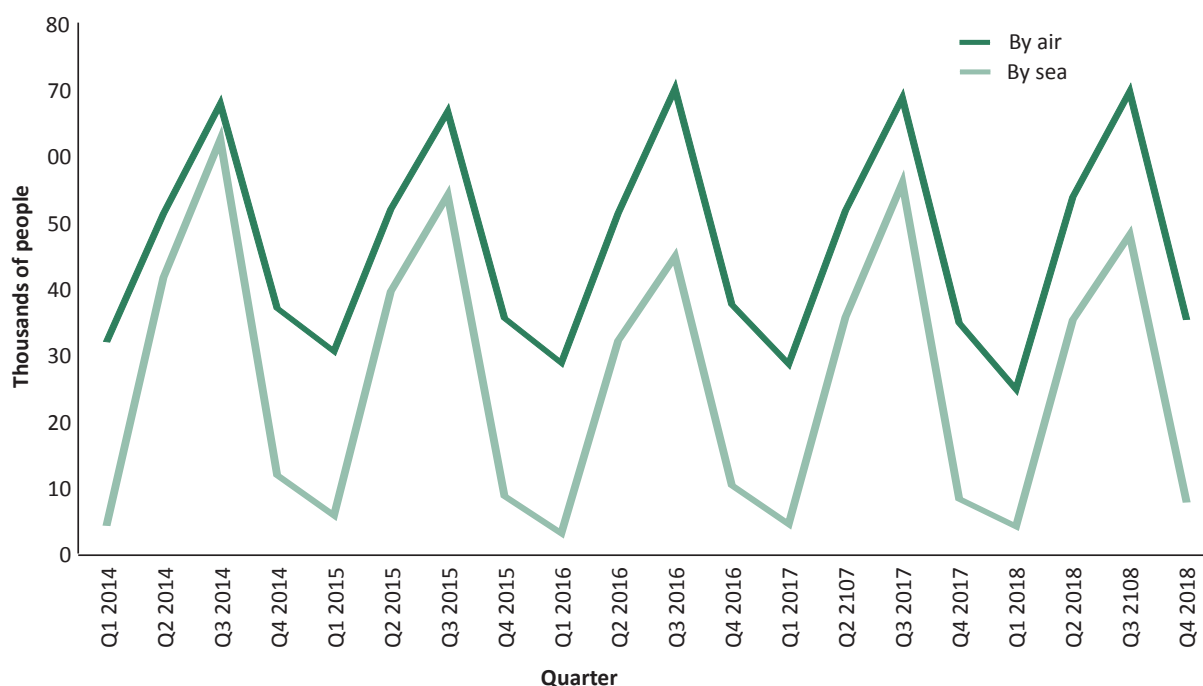

2.5 Departing visitors Q4 - by purpose of visit

Table 2.5.1 shows the number of departing visitors during Q4 2018 broken down by purpose of visit. In Q4 2018 the highest proportion of visitors were staying leisure visitors (35%), followed by visitors staying with friends or relatives (VFR) (33%).

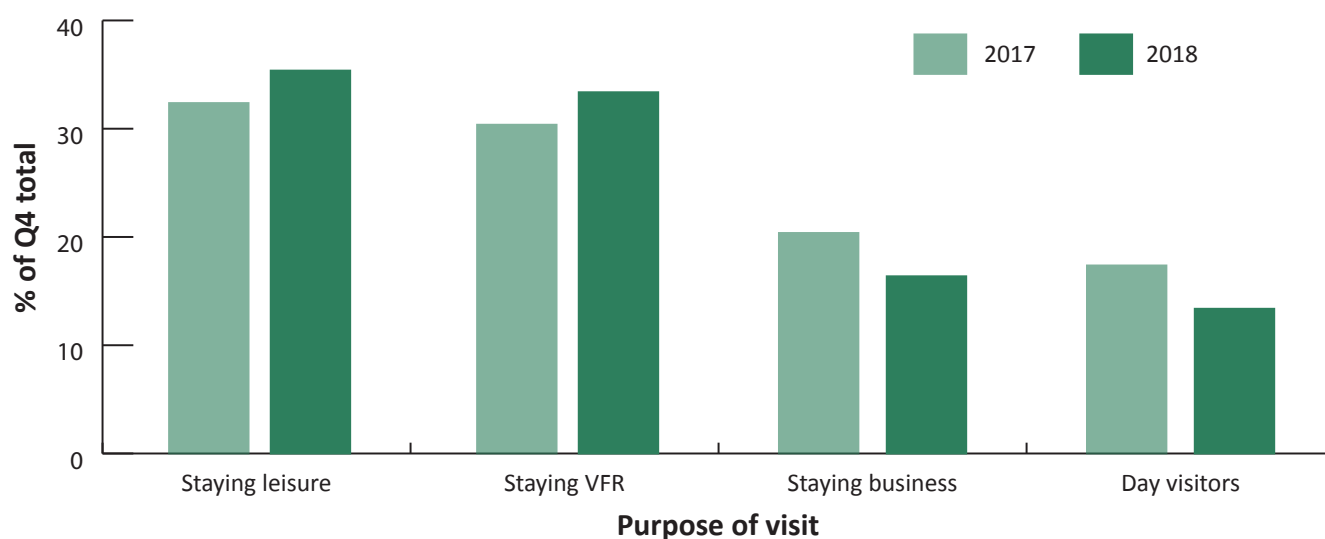
In Q4 2017 the respective percentages were 32% and 30%.

The total number of day visitors during Q4 was 5,668 in 2018, 13% of total visitors. The equivalent figure in Q4 2017 was 7,195, which was 17% of the total visitors for that period.

Table 2.5.2 shows the number of departing visitors during Q4 2018 broken down by mode of transport and purpose of visit. In Q4 2018 the highest proportion of visitors by air were those staying at least one night with friends or family (35%) followed by staying leisure visitors, whereas for visitors travelling by sea, the highest was staying leisure (47%) followed by those staying with friends or family.

Figure 2.5.2 Q4 2018 departing visitors by air - purpose of visit

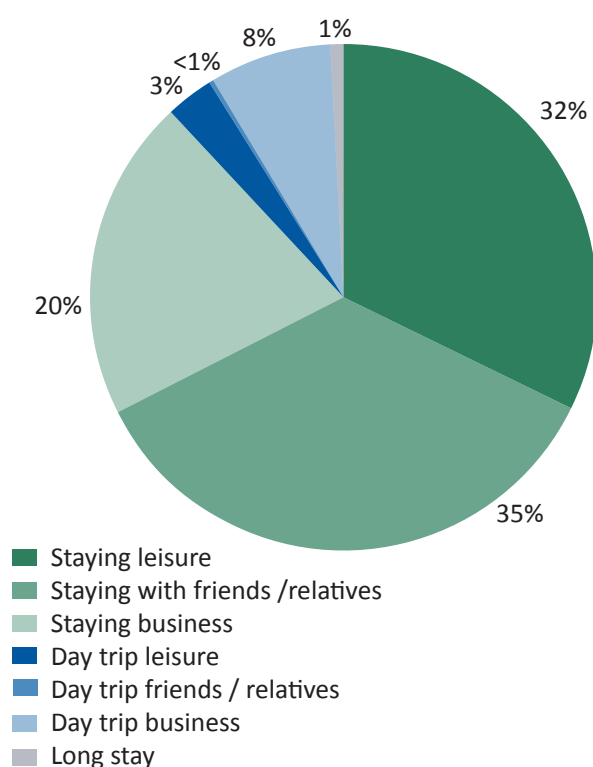
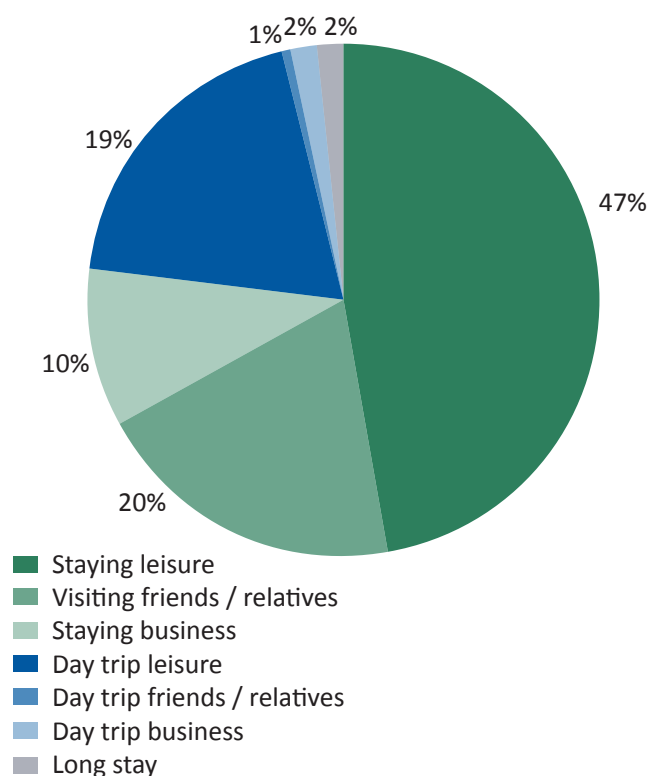


Figure 2.5.3 Q4 2018 departing visitors by sea - purpose of visit



2.6 Departing visitors January to December - by purpose of visit

Table 2.6.1 shows the number of departing visitors for the period from January to December 2018 broken down by purpose of visit. In this period the highest proportion of visitors were staying leisure visitors (51%), followed by visitors staying with friends or relatives (VFR) (20%) and staying business visitors (12%).

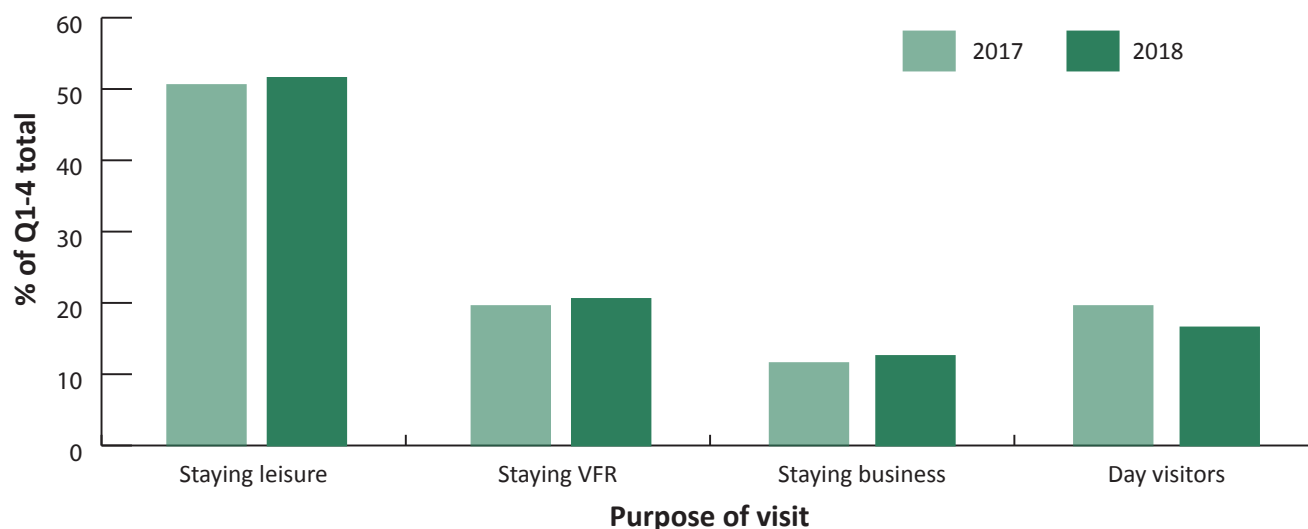
From January to December 2017 the respective percentages were 50%, 19% and 11%.

Figure 2.6.2 Jan to Dec 2018 departing visitors by air - purpose of visit

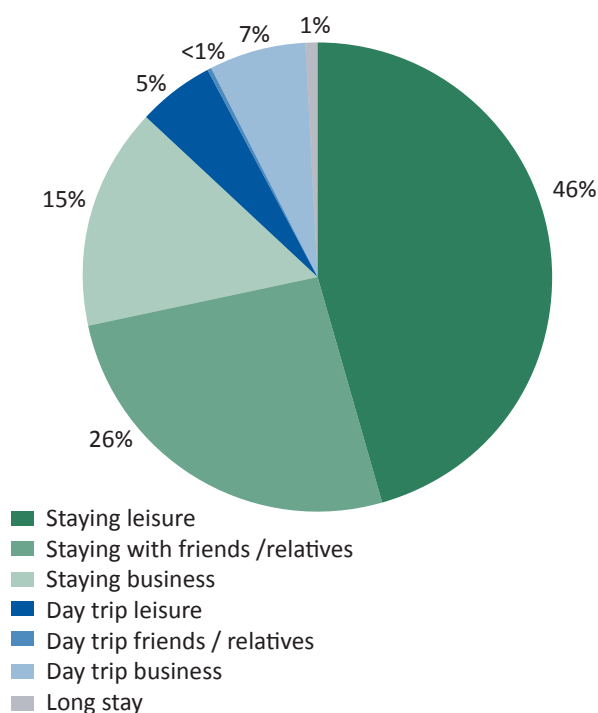
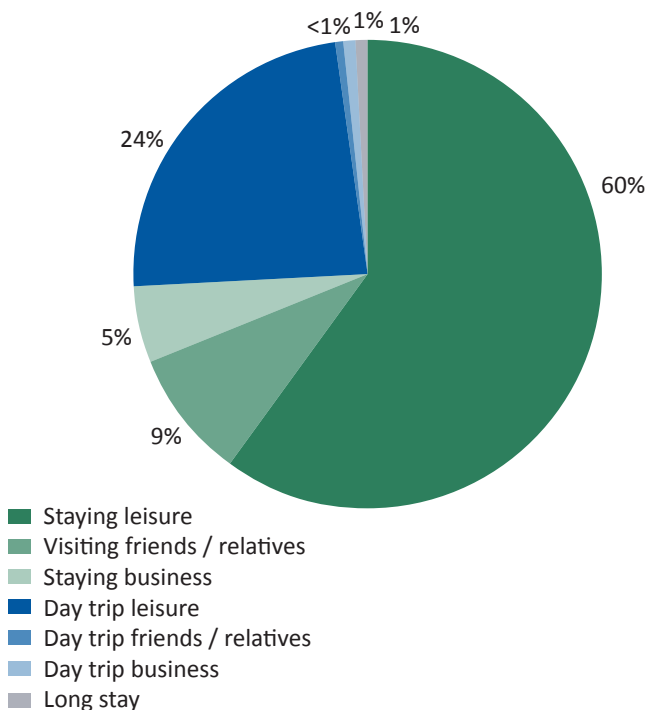
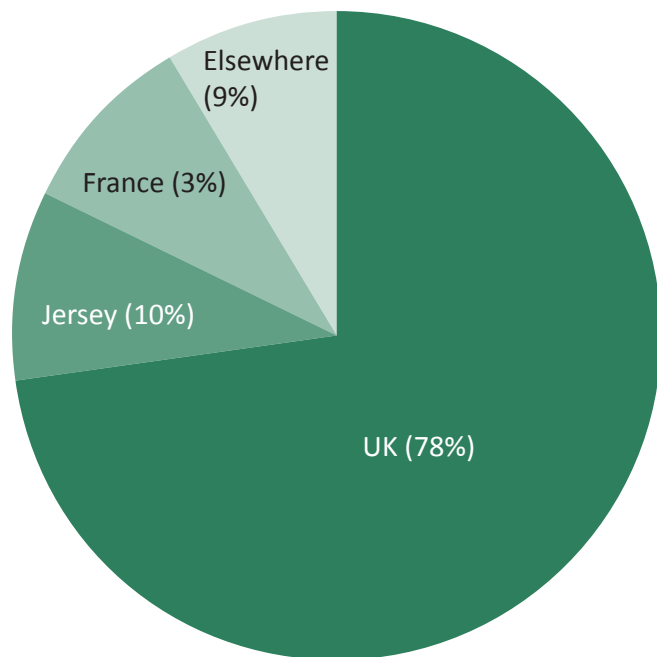


Figure 2.6.3 Jan to Dec 2018 departing visitors by sea - purpose of visit

Figure 2.8.1 Jan to Dec 2018 departing visitors by country of residence

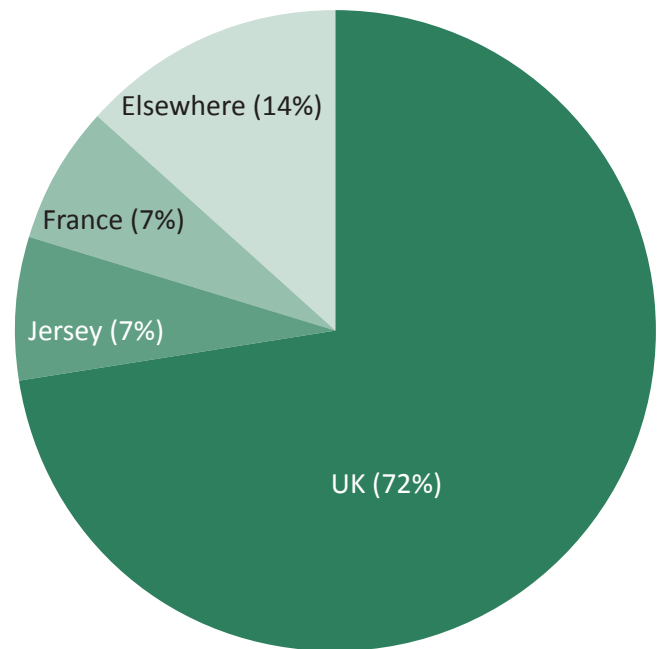

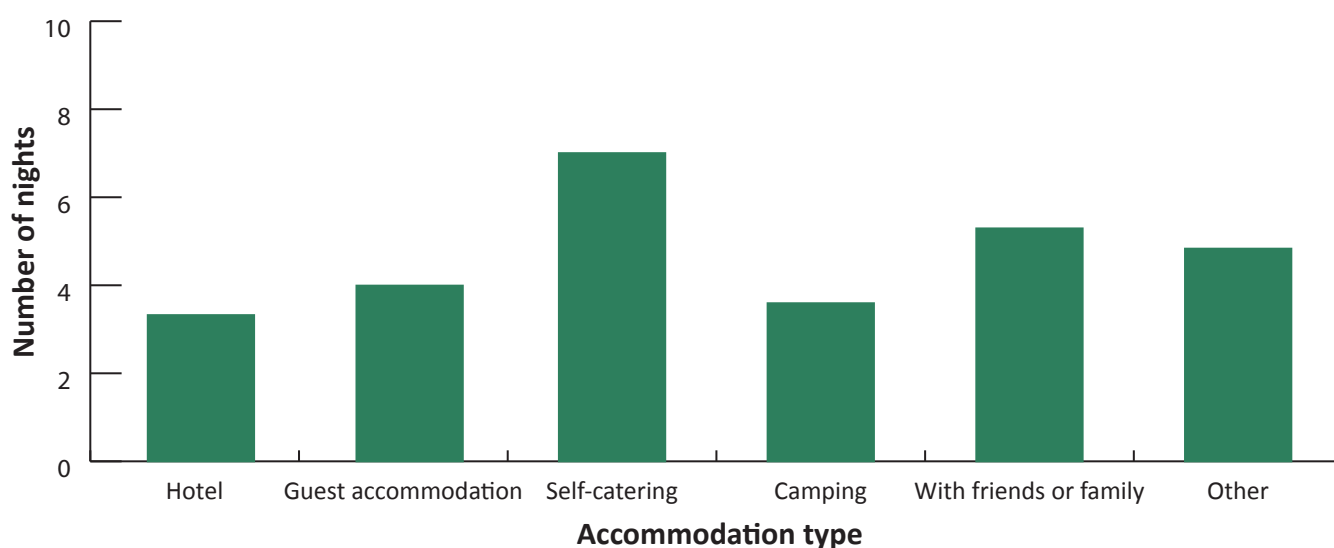

2.10 Departing visitors January to December - by accommodation & length of stay

More people stayed in hotel accommodation than in any other type of accommodation during the period January to December 2018 (62%) (**Table 2.10.1**).

The overall average length of stay was 4.66 nights during the period January to December 2018.

In total there were 1,085,085 overnight stays during the period January to December 2018, of which 778,744 were in commercial accommodation.

In the same period of 2017 these figures were 1,131,283 and 808,935, giving decreases of 4% each.

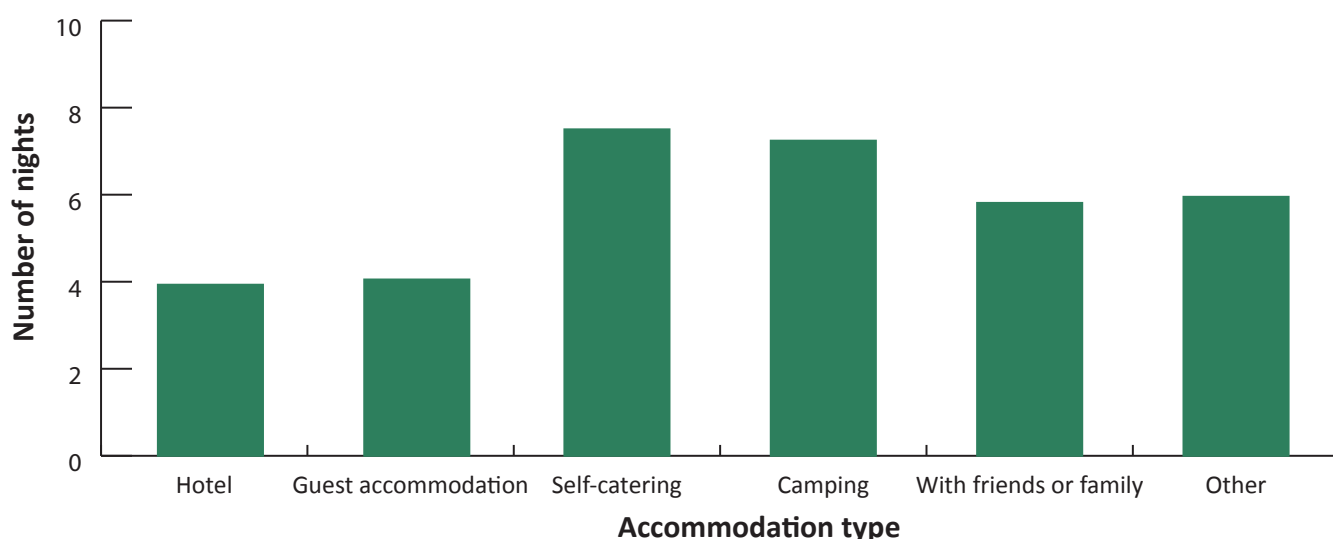

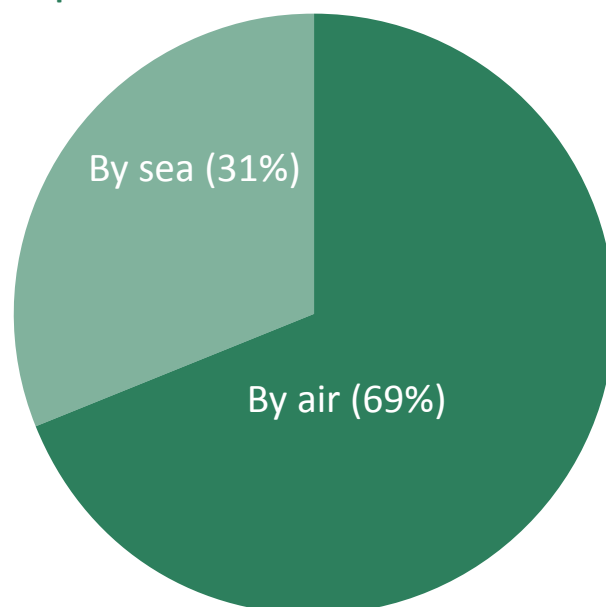

The majority of departing visitors on a day trip were travelling by air (69% in Q4 2018), as shown in **Figure 2.11.1**.

As a percentage of overall departing visitors, day visitors comprised 13% of the total (**Table 2.11.1**).

2.12 Departing visitors January to December - day visitors

The majority of departing visitors on a day trip were travelling by sea (53% in the period January to December 2018), as shown in **Figure 2.12.1**.

As a percentage of overall departing visitors, day visitors comprised 16% of the total (**Table 2.12.1**).

Table 2.12.2 shows that 71% of day visits were for leisure purposes, and 27% for business purposes.

Figure 2.12.1 Jan to Dec 2018 day visitors by mode of transport

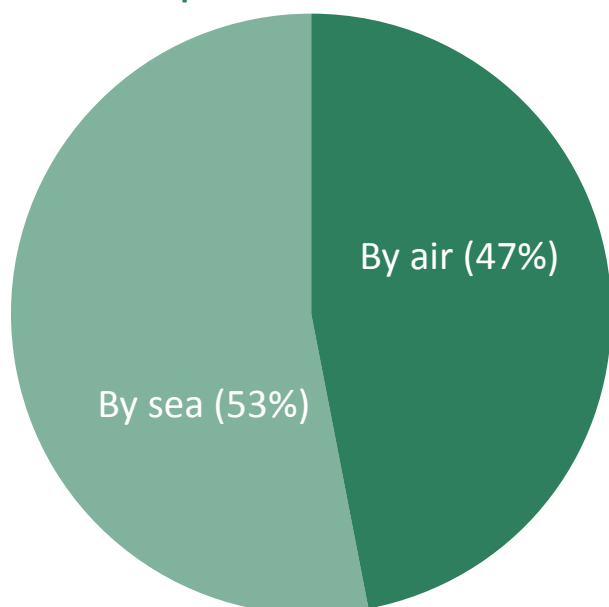

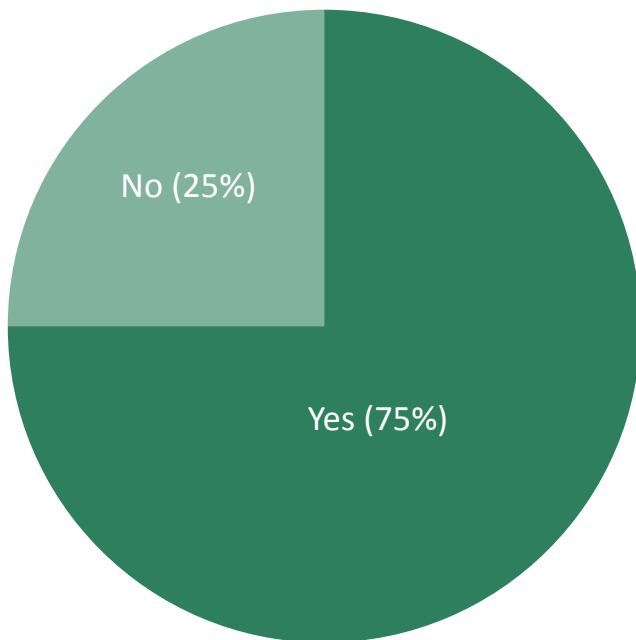

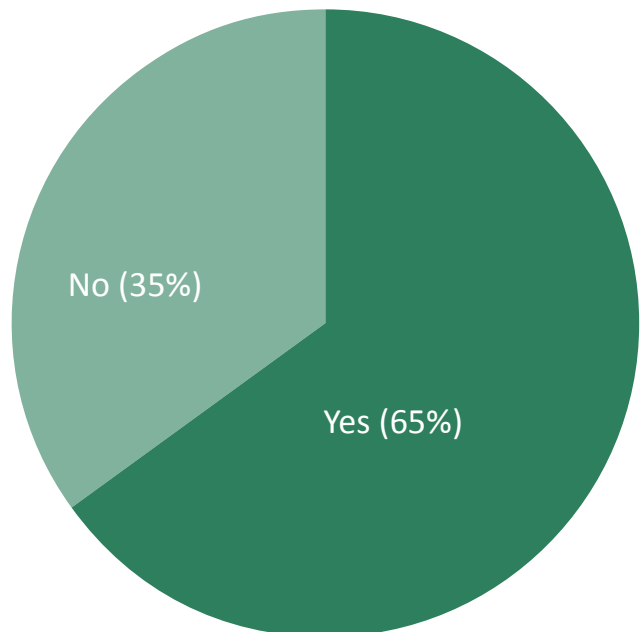

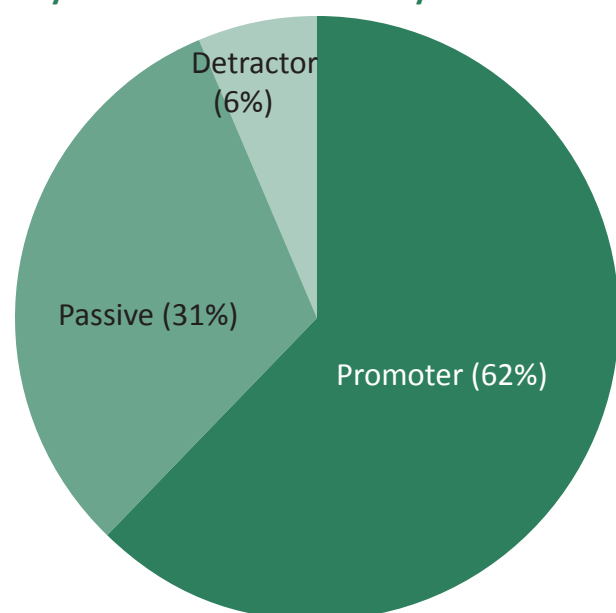

Since 2014 visitors have been asked how likely they were, on a scale of 1 to 10, to recommend Guernsey to friends and family.

Those giving an answer of 9 or 10 were categorised as “promoters”, those giving 7 or 8 were “passives” and those giving 0 to 6 were “detractors” (**Table 3.1.1**). An overall net promoter score (NPS) was found by subtracting the proportion of detractors from the proportion of promoters.

In Q4 2018 the NPS was 56.2. This compares with 48.0 in Q4 2017.

3.2 Recommendations of Guernsey - January to December

Since 2014 visitors have been asked how likely they were, on a scale of 1 to 10, to recommend Guernsey to friends and family.

Those giving an answer of 9 or 10 were categorised as “promoters”, those giving 7 or 8 were “passives” and those giving 0 to 6 were “detractors” (**Table 3.2.1**). An overall net promoter score (NPS) was found by subtracting the proportion of detractors from the proportion of promoters.

For the period January to December 2018 the NPS was 56.8. This compares with 51.4 for the whole of 2017.

A breakdown of promoters, passives and detractors is given in **Figure 3.2.1**.

Figure 3.2.1 Jan to Dec 2018 breakdown of visitors likely to recommend Guernsey

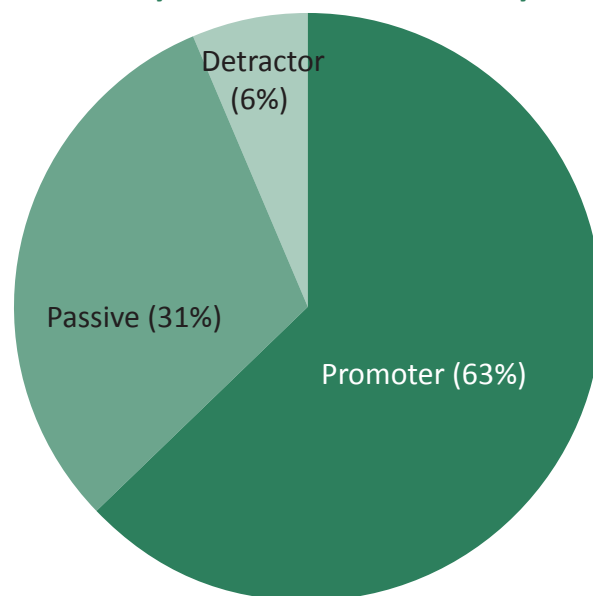

5.1 Onward flights

Residents and departing visitors were asked if they were flying onwards after their initial destination airport.

Table 5.1.1 shows that in Q4 2018, 20% of all passengers were flying on to another airport. 10,838 Guernsey residents (19% of total) and 7,609 of departing visitors (21% of total) were flying onwards in the fourth quarter of 2018.

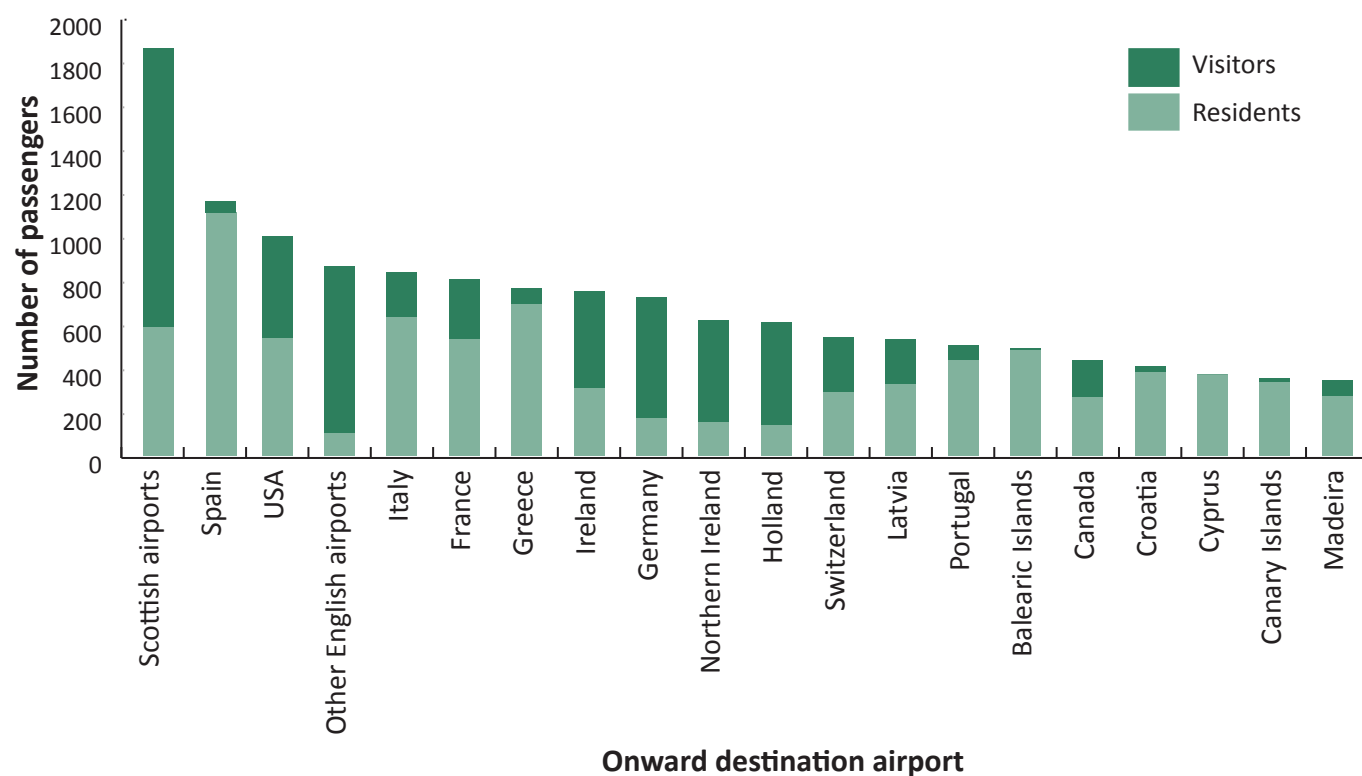

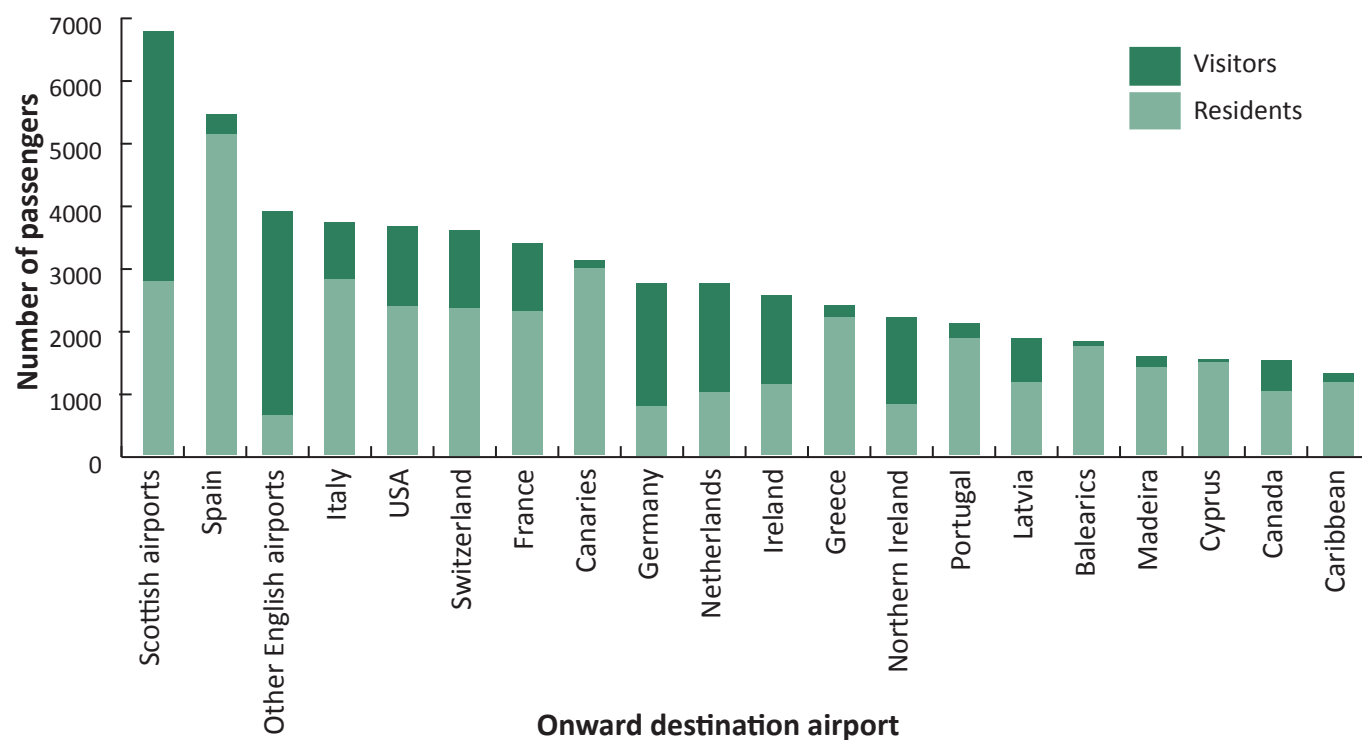

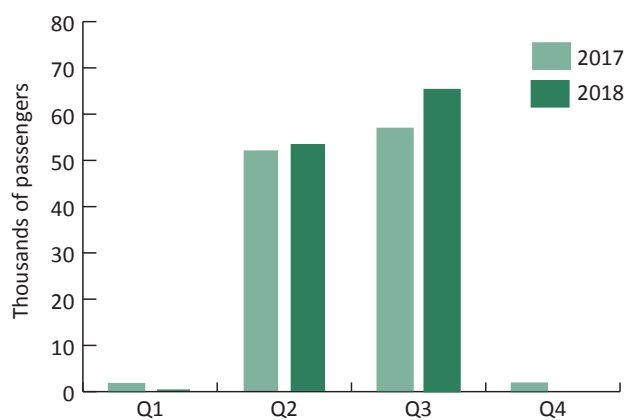

Figure 6.2.1 Visiting yachtsmen

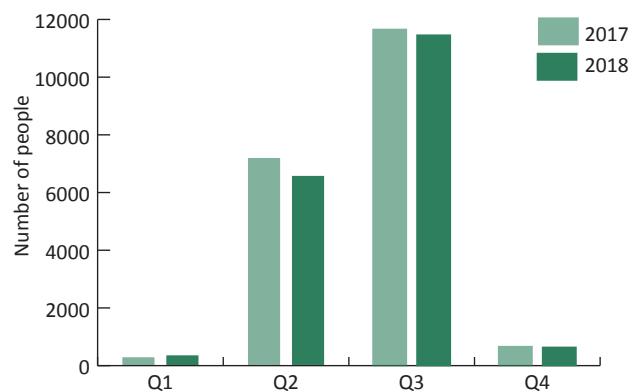

7.1 Methodology

Surveys are undertaken at Guernsey's airport and harbour to determine the composition of passengers. The results are analysed and applied to the actual numbers of passengers (provided by the airport and harbour authorities). For the smaller routes, cumulative passenger numbers are used, giving more statistically accurate results.

The face-to-face interviews are conducted in shifts, covering all routes, days of the week and times of day. The interviewee selection process is as random as possible and targets one person per travelling party.

In April 2017 the interview questionnaire was updated following a move from paper-based, face-to-face interviews to a digital questionnaire. In addition, the move from quarterly to monthly data collection meant that shift patterns were also updated to reflect this.

In Q4 2018 a total of 7,053 interviews were completed, which represented 13,156 passengers. This is 12% of the total number of passengers departing Guernsey during Q4 2018 (excluding inter-Bailiwick travel). On an annual basis, the 28,803 interviews represented 11% of all departing passengers.
