

## going green

Gentle, car-free Herm, one of the Islands of Guernsey, is taking more steps to achieve carbon neutrality. Its ferry service from Guernsey now uses hydrotreated vegetable oil, made by Jersey supplier Rubis Channel Islands, and next up is the conversion of all boilers on the 0.77-square-mile island to 100 per cent renewable heating oil.






## Guernsey to receive over 147,000 cruise passengers in 2023

Guernsey, one of the Channel Islands, is set to receive a total of 147,000 passengers and 86 cruise ships this year, including 12 new vessels making their inaugural visits to the island.

Guernsey port's cruise season began on 15 April with the arrival of Parktown's Braemar and will end on 30 October with a call from MSC's Odissea.

Ships due to make maiden visits to the island include: Ambassador Cruise Line's Amazon, MSC Eureka, National Geographic's NG Revolution, Oceania Cruises' Riviera, Princess La Serenade, La Chantier, Princess Cruise's Regal Princess, Regent Seven Seas Cruise's Seven Seas Explorer and Silversea's Silver Shadow.

Some of the more unusual highlights for guests visiting the port include visiting the German Underground Hospital, which was used by German troops during the Battle of Guernsey, and taking a walk along the South Coast cliffs and visiting Guernsey's sustainable Recyclable Cider.

## A WALK FOR EVERY DAY IN MAY

The wildflowers are out and the weather is warming up – now is the time to get your walking boots out, says Sarah Baxter

**1 STAFFORDSHIRE**  
Happy Staffordshire Day! The county rejoices on May 1, the date Josiah Wedgwood founded his pottery company in 1759. An apt way to mark the occasion is by joining Staffordshire's Three Peaks Challenge, a 4-mile trek around the county's highest summits. To continue the celebrations, treat yourself to a lane hut or treehouse at the Tarny, Staffordshire's large hotel of the year – as well as having enormous grounds it's right next to RSPB Connal Woods, which is perfect for wildlife-filled spring strolls. **Details** One night's self-catering for two from £255 (thetarny.co.uk); festival to May 1 (staffordshirewalkingfestival.co.uk)

the beginning of the 17th century, the tradition was to form a coronation procession from the Tower of London to Westminster Abbey. As King Charles III's coronation looms, re-enact the historic route. The British Pilgrimage Trust has mapped a five-mile walk through the capital along this old royal route, via holy wells, tombs, churches and Roman temples. Download it or join the trust's expert Guy Hayward for a guided, surprise-filled urban pilgrimage in coronation week (May 2; £70pp). Guernsey is one of the country's sunniest spots, and the lengthening May days provide the perfect backdrop for its wonderful walking festival. Guided strolls of varying lengths provide insight into the bailiwick, from its Second World War history to its farming and folklore. The top pick is the two-mile Walking in the Footsteps of Renoir and Victor Hugo route, visiting Moulin Huet Bay and the cottage where Renoir painted, which is usually off limits (May 21; £15). Embrace the warming weather at Camp de Reves, where posh tents have sea views and four-poster beds. **Details** One night's self-catering for six from £175 (guernseyglamping.com); festival May 20-June 4 (visitguernsey.com)

#### SOAK UP SOME CULTURE

The artist of Les Minérales passed his French interwar period among other classics during the 15 years he spent working in Guernsey. He was exiled from his home in France following the coup d'état by Louis-Napoléon Bonaparte in 1851. After being expelled from Belgium and Jersey, Hugo made his home in Guernsey. Situated a 15-minute walk from the cruise terminal in St Peter Port, the **Pan-noramy Museum** was inspired by the artist and designed by Hugo himself and built as a work of art. Recently restored to its former glory, visitors can take a one-hour guided tour through the house (this must be booked in advance). The terraced garden is a bonus feature.

As well as Hugo, we are proud to have an association with the artist, Pierre-Auguste Renoir who visited the island in 1883 and created 15 depictions of Moulin Huet. There's a Renoir Walk along the South Coast where you can discover the views that inspired his paintings.

#### RELAX BY THE COAST

Take it from us, Guernsey's oceans are not the norm to visitors in during the summer months, but they can provide a refreshing guide to the hot weather and there are some lovely sandy beaches. Victoria Bay is a personal favourite, with two blonde and a stretching coastline. Building sandcastles is not the only activity the Guernsey coast has to offer, however. Companies such as **Outdoor Guernsey** provide visitors with a variety of options, such as sailing, kayaking and stand-up paddle-boarding. For more of an adrenaline rush, r'n'vogue and counter-surfing (exploring a rocky coastline by jumping, climbing, and swimming) are available.

If your clients have more time to spend on the island, they can take a day trip to car-free Sark. It is a smaller island, **only 15 minutes away by boat**, and the crystal clear sea provides a change of scene, as well as access to a large puffin colony, which can be viewed on a Puffin Patrol kayak tour with Outdoor Guernsey (April to July).

Any mention of Guernsey is often preceded by its larger neighbour, Jersey. Both islands are just off the coast of Normandy, but Guernsey is well worth visiting on its own merit, with interesting history and beautiful scenery.

Like Jersey, the island was occupied during World War Two, and still bears the scars of this period of history – the coastline is dotted with well-powered fortifications built by the German army and there are a bunch of museums that tell the story of those dark days.
